### **Words from The Chair**

t the time of writing it is early May, the blossom is out everywhere and I am praying that the glorious April weather we have had isn't our summer over! This year we saw the best display of spring flowering bulbs on the riverbank we have ever seen. After years of growing and reproducing under a thick mat of undergrowth, the spring bulbs that must have been planted 30 years ago surged into the best ever flowering display I have ever seen. The extremely cold winter probably helped, but there is no doubt that allowing the bulbs plenty of sunlight last year, in their newly cleared riverbank, did them a world of good. As a great poet friend of mine put it, "Last year's flowers ate light and grew again" (Sarah Reilly). My photographs don't do them justice, but I hope you like them.

Regular visitors to the green will also have noticed a plethora of bat boxes have been placed in the trees along the riverbank. Hereford Action for mammals paid for and installed them and Widemarsh Workshop made them. We are hoping they provide summer nesting sites for the pipistrelle bats that can be seen feeding along the length of the Wye at dusk. The Riverbank team have also introduced a wild flower seed mix which includes teasel, purple loose strife, foxglove and common toad flax. We are not sure whether they will take off this year or next, but I for one am keeping my fingers crossed. They have also experimented with a few native junipers and some spindle which, if it takes, will bring some lovely winter colour. On top of all that, there have been some natural arrivals. Three or four honesty plants have taken hold with their gorgeous pink/purple flowers – lets' hope they spread. *Mark Hubbard*




## **Litter Pick**
